Class Rules and Expectations

Rights and Responsibilities

Expectation #1: Be Prepared

 - Study your review sheets before test and quizzes
 - Ask questions if something is unclear

 - Turn in your assignment typed neatly, with correct headings, and on time
 - Assignments turned in late gets "0" credit, with the exception for legal absence.

Expectation #2 Attending

- Arrive on time; you are expected to be in your seat when class starts
- Once seated, get out your notebook paper and pen/pencil; prepare to take notes.
 Please do not wait for me to remind you.
- Attend to personal needs before coming to class. Do not ask to be excused during the first fifteen minutes of class or during a lecture unless you have a real emergency.
- Remain in the assigned seat unless you have permission to get up.

- Throw scraps away at the end of the period on your way out and do NOT sharpen pencils while I am speaking to the whole class.
- Do not eat candy or other food in class unless you have been given special permission.
- Pick up handouts
- Turn in assignments on time
- Stay on task
- If you are late you are to take your place quietly

Expectation #3 Responsibility

- Stay on task
- If handouts are given during class, make sure you do not leave without them.
- Listen to directions.
- Take responsibility for your work; don't make excuses.
- Do not cheat. Students caught cheating will receive a zero in addition to a referral
 to the office and a phone call home. Both the student who shares his work for an
 independent assignment AND the person who copies it will suffer.
- Clean up. Leave your seat clean and organized
- If you have a question or problem, please talk to me or write me a note. I can be flexible if I understand the situation.

Expectations #4 Respect

- Treat others the way you want to be treated.
- Help each other and work cooperatively when appropriate.
- No name calling; use good manners and appropriate language.
- Show respect to the person speaking by:
 - 1. Staying focused
 - 2. Being quiet
 - 3. Requesting to speak with raised hand
- Respect the opinion and feelings of others.
- 1. Listen and discuss without being judgmental
- Remember that thank you goes a long way!
- Respect others peoples' property.
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
- Listen actively.
